Streets, Alleys, and Sidewalks - *Hadley, Neal, Johnson, Schissel

Review issues related to streets, sidewalks alleys and other concerns related to the street department. Reviews plans for the growth, improvement, and maintenance of the street system including capital improvements programming,

annual projects and requests. Street related improvements generally include those whose construction, acquisition or maintenance costs may be funded with Road Use Tax (RUT) funds and / or Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) revenues.
