1. Alley Assessments

There is a plan in place for the street department to redo four alleys that are adjacent to 3rd Street. Jeremy Bril spoke with the Committee regarding if they should move forward with assessing the property owners for these four alleys. Usually in the past the property owners are billed for the asphalt only, no other repairs. Majority of the committee agreed that the property owners should be assessed. Jeremy will start the process.

2. FY23 Street Plan

- a. Intersection Improvements
- b. Sidewalk Projects

Bril went over map and financials on what the street department is looking to do this upcoming season for intersection improvements and sidewalk projects. Nothing specific was decided on. They would concentrate more on city owned property for the new sidewalks.

3. 5th Avenue Bridge Lighting

There is an anonymous donor who would like to donate money to put more lights on the 5th Avenue bridge. The total cost for three lights would be over \$18,000.00. In the past neighbors of this bridge has complained about too much light. Zittergruen did reach out to some of the neighbors and there was not a lot of support for the project. Other Council members also did not think it was worth spending city money on this project since the donation would not cover the whole cost.

4. Snow Hangers

Committee discussed the use of door hangers. The plan is to have two different door hangers; one for winter and one for spring.

Streets, Alleys, and Sidewalks - *Hadley, Neal, Johnson, Schissel

Review issues related to streets, sidewalks alleys and other concerns related to the street department. Reviews plans for the growth, improvement, and maintenance of the street system including capital improvements programming, annual projects and requests. Street related improvements generally include those whose construction, acquisition or maintenance costs may be funded with Road Use Tax (RUT) funds and / or Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) revenues.
